1. ENTRIES: Pre-registration is mandatory.

2. FEES:

- a) \$13.00 per class or \$130.00 for unlimited classes per horse/handler for the weekend.

3. STABLING:

Stabling available. Stalls are \$80/weekend
Extra shavings \$11/bale. No outside shavings permitted.

5. EQUINES: Age of equine shall be that reached during the calendar year 2026.
All equines welcome! Stallions/Jacks not to be handled by anyone under 18. Must be in a chain and under control at all times. If this is not the case, they will be asked to leave the premises without refund.

6. EXHIBITORS:

- a) Age as of January 1, 2026

The same animal may be show by different handlers in different age categories

- b) Dogs (aside from registered service animals) are not permitted on site.

7. HELMETS: Are encouraged and will never be penalized. All youth exhibitors must have properly fitted and certified helmets on when riding or driving.

8. RULES:

- a) Have FUN and be SAFE!
- b) ADMC, the Show Committee and The Pointe Ag Society will not be responsible for any loss, damage or injury to persons, equine, or property at this show.
- c) All classes are at the decision of the Judge. Classes may be merged or split based on participation numbers.
- d) Show attire not required but welcome. Two hands welcome in all classes, as required for the animal and rider.
- e) *No cross entry between walk trot and regular classes.*

9. Obstacle Race:

This fast-paced horsemanship based class will be loosely based on Extreme Cowboy Racing rules.

Each class will have a different pre-set course of 8-13 obstacles depending on the division. The judge will do a walk through with all the competitors before the start of each class. One at a time, each competitor will enter the arena and wait behind the start line. When the whistle blows, the rider may cross the start line and begin the course, 30 seconds are allowed to cross the start line. The judge will give a score for each obstacle out of 10, plus an overall horsemanship score out of 10, and time points will be awarded at one point per 20 seconds under 8 minutes. The obstacles will be judged on correctness, speed with control, and style. The obstacles must be completed in order. Each obstacle will have a 30 second time limit. If exceeded, the judge will blow the whistle to indicate that you must move on to the next obstacle. Horses being ridden must be in Western or Australian gear and attire. No nosebands, training aids, whips on a ridden horse, or bits with any gag action.

Divisions:

R1. In Hand - horses will complete obstacles in hand with no other equipment. Handlers may carry a whip. Scores will favor soft communication without touching the horse, horses being sent over obstacles without the handler, and speed with control. There will be 8 obstacles plus a horsemanship score and time points. Rope halters, nylon/leather halters, chain or rope lead ropes, or bridles are all allowed.

R2. Ground Driving - horses will complete the obstacles while being ground driven in either a harness or surcingle. Driver must carry a whip. Scores will favor soft communication, good body position behind the drive line, and speed with control. There will be 8 obstacles in this division plus a horsemanship score and time points. Horse may be driven in an open or closed bridle, or a halter. Lines MUST be split.

R3. Novice - This ridden division is for entry-level riders that have only just learned the basics of walk, trot, canter, and basic body control with or without obstacles, and have little to no experience or success in any discipline. The obstacles will be very basic. There will be 10 obstacles in this division plus a horsemanship score and time points.

R4. Intermediate - This division is for riders that have some experience with obstacles or in other disciplines, and are comfortable adding speed in some circumstances. The obstacles may have some added complexity. There will be 13 obstacles in this division plus a horsemanship score and time points.

R5. Open division - This division is for experienced obstacle racers. The obstacles will increase in difficulty. There will be 13 obstacles in this division plus a horsemanship score and time points.

Riders may choose up to two consecutive divisions. This event will be a great introduction to the sport and very friendly for first-time competitors!

10. CLASS DESCRIPTIONS:

- a) DRIVING CLASSES –
-Ground Driving may not cross enter to a hitched class except for Green ass Grass.
-Ground-Driving and Reinsmanship patterns to be posted the evening prior to classes at show office.

-Junior drivers age 14 - 18 may drive a VSE (under 39") alone. Ages 13 and under must have a competent adult in the vehicle at all times. Helmets are mandatory for junior drivers.

-Pleasure classes to be shown both direction in walk, slow trot, regular trot and extended trot, halt and back readily.

-A whip must always be in hand when driving.

-Teddy Bear Class – Dress up your favorite teddy bear to join you for a class!

-Scurry – 4 x figure 8 around pilons. Fastest time wins.

- b) HALTER CLASSES – Any aged handler. Competitors may show more than one horse in a class provided they have people to hold the other horses.
- c) SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES – Patterns will be posted at show office the evening before classes.
- d) PLEASURE CLASSES – English and Western, each entry will be judged according to riding style and breed standard.
- e) COSTUME CLASS – Open to all ages.
- f) GAMES – More games may be added at no additional cost providing sufficient time.
- g) EQUITATION – English and Western, pattern will be posted at the show office.
- h) HUNTER – Over fences to be judged on way of going and technique over fences. Only 2 consecutive classes may be entered by any exhibitor.
- i) COON JUMPING – A long-ears classic! Animals are led and must establish a full halt in the "box" prior to attempting to jump. Exclusive to long ears.
- j) PANCAKE – All supplies will be provided. Make your best pancake for the judges to sample! One animal to a team of 2-3 people.

11. PRIZES

- a) Rosettes to 6th place will be awarded
- b) Top Long Ear will be awarded in designated classes (see class lists) indicated by **
- c) Championship buckles will be awarded to: Top Driving Long Ears, Top Youth Handler, Top Ridden Long Ears (English and Western), and Top Overall Long Ears. Points accrued based on class placings.
